My father Raymond Barnes has been a resident at Cambridge Manor since December 2001. Due to a stroke he has no use of his right arm and can not walk. The stroke also effected his mental status leaving him unable to speak clearly and sometime confused. He has been under 24 hour care since 1999.

The care he receives at Cambridge Manor is the best any where, far exceeding my expectations of the kind of loving care my father or any elderly deserve.

I have inspected over 25 assisted living homes in the Atlanta area. None of these facilities meet the minimum requirements of elderly care. Even though they are inspected by state and county officials.

All of my fathers needs are cared for every moment day and night. He is dressed every morning in fresh clean cloths, shaved, washed and his teeth brushed. Never is there any odor from him or his room. He is receives three nutritious meals every day along with fresh snacks in between. His medicine is all ways given at the correct dosage and time. I visit my father at least five times each week and have never seen any problems. I have been involved with caring for sick and elderly relatives most of my life. At home, in nursing homes and in hospitals. The care my father receives at Cambridge Manor far exceeds the care given any where I have ever seen.
